

In this copyright page, everything is fine on Mac OS, but the text is centred and in italics in Windows, despite the request to keep it “as is” in the compile format used.

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Errors

List corruption issue

This shows the issue with list formatting when you open a document created on Mac OS in Windows.

- This document (test bugs beta 20) is created in the latest Scrivener 3.1.3 on Mac OS using the non-fiction (general non fiction) template. All settings to default.
- As you can see, each list item starts with a checklist symbol, not a bullet point.
- When opened in Windows (I open a copy to make sure the original created in Mac OS is never touched/modified by the windows beta), the checklist symbols are replaced with a bullet point. This has been the case with all tested betas since I reported it in beta 18 (I didn't test it before). It still happens in beta 19, beta 20, beta 21 (RC1) and beta 22 (RC2).
- Occasionally, on the first line, the bullet point is added to the checklist symbol, so you get bullet point, tab, checklist, tab, item. [This seems to be fixed in the latest betas].
- The checkmark isn't an option in the PC version, it only seems to offer bullet point, circle and square, so maybe it hasn't been implemented yet?
- When opening the document back on the Mac, the checkmark appear again, so it seems to be a display bug on PC rather than a destructive issue that replaces check marks with bullet points.

I have dozens of such checklists in my manuscripts, so correcting this manually isn't an option.

Error TOC #1 all page numbers identical

In Windows, after compile to PDF, all the page numbers are identical in the TOC.

In Mac OS, there is no such issue.

Error TOC #2 some corrupted entries

In Windows, after compile to PDF, some TOC entries are corrupted and start with

In Mac OS, there is no such issue.

Asterix instead of blank lines

Since Beta 22, *** are insterted instead of blank lines when compiled with the PC version, as below:

No such issue in the Mac, using the same compile format.

There are no * in the blank line separator in the compile format, in any of the sections.

Wrong header

Since Beta 22 (not tested in previous versions), headers are not compiled properly in the PC version. Instead of the section title, they show <\$sectiontitle>.
